We will do this in a variety of ways, perhaps including but not limited to ...

attention to social justice for African Americans, Hispanics, and all people

- expand offerings of any programs or ministries that help to build bridges across major divides of race, immigration, refugee settlement, or access to resources such as education, healthcare, and internet
- stand up against systemic racism and abuse
- dismantle racism in our diocese, calling out institutions and persons of power who promote racism
- continued support of the Farmworker ministry, perhaps in new and expanded forms to engage new populations
- understand Creation Care as a ministry of justice
- ❖ work together to take on challenges that are too big for any one of us
- promote opportunities that allow us to come together despite our differences
- serve as "ambassadors of Christ" (2 Cor. 5:20) and commit to working at reconciliation
